Dad's first barbel









Hi,

Colin Townsend advised me to send some pictures of my dad and I on a recent trip to Fladbury. We fished on the island with 2 rods each; one rod with a maggot feeder mainly for the smaller fish and the odd big chub, bream or barbel that comes along! The maggot feeder was set up with 6lb maxima and a size 16 hook with 3 maggots. The 2nd rod was just for the barbel and chub. We set up 2 barbel rods with 15lb maxima, korda hooks and tried a number of different hook baits including luncheon meat, double 6mm elipse pellets but finally it was 12mm Chapel baits bloodworm boilie combined with Hinders barbel bomb groundbait and hemp that worked! My Dad had the first fish which was a chub at 3lb closely followed by his first barbel at 5lb 1oz. It was a lovely day and at about 2:30 the fish started coming on all methods. We had several chub with the biggest being 4lb but sadly only the one barbel. If you want to put the barbel weight on the website my dad's name is David Johnson. He also caught the 7lb 5oz bream at Fladbury, so if you want to change his name to David Johnson you are more than welcome to! I have attached some pictures for the website.

Executive update




Netherseal

In the February 2012 edition we reported on a plan to erect stiles over the new fence alongside the River Mease to make access for anglers easier. Due to the cost, manpower required and low usage by our members we are investigating more cost effective alternatives. We will keep you informed.

The fence was put in place by the land owner at the request of Natural England to prevent cattle getting into the river and polluting it.




Angler's trains

In the days before mass car ownership, anglers from the major cities would often use trains to reach their chosen fishing locations. BAA members could apply for a railway travelling card giving them access to the special trains and cheap fares which ran between the city and stations near the fisheries. Extracts from a 1932 Railway Travelling Card is shown below. The railway companies listed (LMS and GWR) have long since ceased to exist and many of the stations listed such as Fladbury and Ripple have closed or such as Bewdley and Arley are now part of the Severn Valley Railway. Some of the items on the card are still relevant today such as; *Be sure and close Meadow gates. Remove Contest Peg Numbers and leave no Litter.* Some things never change.

The contrast is interesting, last month we provided a list of SatNav references for our fishery car parks. The railway travelling card lists the nearest stations for each fishery.

Four billiard tables and weekend concerts may be a bit of a squeeze at Hagley HQ!

Waters Rented by the Association.

Stratford-on-Avon Canal, 25 miles.

By arrangement with the Great Western Railway Company and the Lords of the Manor, through which the Canal passes, and Owners of Land adjoining the Navigation, from Lifford (near King's Norton) to Stratford-on-Avon, including the junction with the Warwick and Birmingham Canal near Kingswood, but excluding Earlswood Reservoirs. Fishing only from the Towing Path.

Licenses required: From Lapworth towards
Birmingham—Trent; towards Stratford—Severn.

No Bicycles allowed on the Canal without the Company's Permit, 2/6 per annum.

River Severn at Bridgnorth, about 2 miles.

On the right bank down stream from Bridgnorth the fishing commences at Knowle Sands and continues to Haye Brook at Eardington. The portion of the brook in the last meadow is included.

The meadows are numbered 1 to 13. No. 1 is at Knowle Sands and No. 13 at Eardington.

Headquarters: Knowle Sands—The Swan. Station: Bridgnorth. Eardington—The Crown. Station: Eardington.

On the left bank down stream at Quatford, meadows No. 2 to 7, above the rock towards Bridgnorth.

Headquarters: The Danery. Stations: Eardington or Bridgmorth.

River Severn at Bewdley, 2 miles.

From Bewdley cross the River Bridge, turn to the left and follow the path down stream to the Timber Wharf Gate, below Blackstone Rock. Fishing commences in meadow No. 4 and extends down stream to Gladder Brook (meadow No. 7).

Headquarters: Thurston Hotel. Station: Bewdley.

From Stourport cross River Bridge, turn up stream on the left bank of the river. Fishing commences at meadow No. 7 (Gladder Brook) and continues to the first gate at the Timber Wharf (meadow No. 4), Bewdley.

Headquarters: Bridge Hotel and Crown Hotel. Station: Stourport.

River Severn at Tewkesbury, 4½ miles.

Bushley, meadows No. 1 to 19, right bank down stream. No. 1 meadow is near the Barley House, No. 19 at Mythe Bridge. For meadows No. 1 to 8, book to Ripple and ferry over.

Headquarters: Railway Inn. Station and Ferry: Ripple.

Cross Mythe Bridge, turn to the right (meadow No. 19) and continue on the left bank up stream to the Barley House (meadow No. 1).

Ripple, left bank down stream, meadows No. 1 to 4. These meadows are about one mile from Mythe Bridge. Do not cross Mythe Bridge, but take the right bank up stream.

Headquarters: Various. Station: Tewkesbury.

River Severn, about 3 miles.

Meadows No. 1 to 12, along the Dudmaston Estate from Quatford to Hampton Loade, left bank down stream. No. 1 meadow is near The Danery, Quatford, and meadow No. 12 is at Hampton Loade.

River Severn at Arley, about 4 miles.

On the right bank down stream from Bargate Cottage to Arley Ferry (meadows No. 1 to 4) and from Seckley Cottage to the end of the wood just above Folly Point.

Headquarters: The Harbour.

On the left bank down stream (meadows No. 1 to 6) from the top boundary of Bromley Farm to Arley Ferry, and from below Arley Ferry to Worrall's Mill.

Headquarters: The Valentia. Station: Arley.

River Severn at Buildwas, about 3 miles.

Right and left banks on the Buildwas Park Estate, left bank down stream, meadows No. 0, 1, 2 and 3. These meadows can be reserved for Contests.

Right bank down stream on land belonging to Mr. Davis. After passing farm belonging to Mr. Davis the river can be reached by passing under the railway arch, and also the railway crossing lower down. No Contests are allowed on this bank.

River Severn, about 1 mile.

On the Rhea Hall Estate, Highley, right bank down stream (meadows No. 1 and 2).

Headquarters: The Ship. Station: Highley.

River Severn. about 1 mile.

Hampton Loade. Right bank down stream. A Section, meadows No. 1, 2 and 3. B Section, one meadow
